

Jennifer has over a decade of experience as a VCSE representative on many strategic Boards with the NHS, local authorities and cross sector partnerships.

we are an organisation with a social purpose and a desire to change lives for the better.

We have been providing care and support for over 50 years and celebrate our extraordinary achievements and successes as we have grown to be one of the largest voluntary sector organisations in Sussex. We employ over 1,000 people each year with a wide range of skills and experiences from a variety of backgrounds and cultures. And we support over 9,000 people across 62 services.

We are a registered supported housing provider. In addition, we provide a range of specialist, person-centred support: 24-hour care and support for people with learning disabilities; mental and physical wellbeing support; peer support; homelessness prevention and learning and employment support.

As a not-for-profit specialist provider of care, support and housing services, nearly all our income is derived from public funds, either through commissioned contracts for the care and support services we deliver or the housing benefit we receive as a social landlord.

Alliance activity and latest news

- Three position papers have recently been published by Alliance members:
 - The 'Commissioning Principles', reviewed in July 2022, provides updates and recommendations to improve collaboration in procurement and commissioning through a new culture and ways of working with the VCSE sector.
 - 'VCSE perspectives on Social Prescribing' reflects the Alliance's interest in developing and promoting Social Prescribing to address the wider determinants of health and wellbeing and strengthening the impact for local people through necessary cross sector joint working.
 - 'Cost of Living and Financial Exclusion' paper provides insight into current activities the VCSE sector are undertaking to provide information, guidance and support to those financially struggling.
- A collaborative VCSE Alliance bid to East Sussex County Council has been successful; to provide a social prescribing initiative for young Ukrainian refugees across the County.
- East Sussex VCSE Alliance 'Cost of Living Report' an emerging piece of work researching the
 impact the cost-of-living crisis is having on how the public are accessing services, the delivery of
 services and the impact on VCSE organisations and their staff.
- A commissioning workshop was held in November, co-hosted by East Sussex County Council
 (ESCC) and the VCSE Alliance, attended by leaders from ESCC, voluntary sector, Public Health and
 NHS. A commitment to creating a Commissioning Excellence Programme was agreed, with the
 aim of developing East Sussex as a centre of excellence for VCSE commissioning. Read about the
 workshop and next steps here.
- East Sussex VCSE Alliance Young People Task & Finish group have been awarded a £2.5k development budget to create a Young People's Volunteering & Safeguarding Framework, to support and enable more volunteering opportunities for the young people of East Sussex within Alliance organisations.
- The Children and Young People Health Oversight Board Sally Polanski, CEO of Amaze, is the East Sussex VCSE Alliance Rep. Newly formed, the Board is establishing its remit to bring together and oversee place-based priorities, while driving system-wide agendas and collaboration. Its purpose is to provide effective system oversight and coordination of health and care services for children and young people in Sussex. - Partnership Plus (VCSE Alliance members and leaders from the statutory sector) are progressing their priority of reducing loneliness and isolation by establishing their stewardship approach to tackling loneliness in East Sussex. Workshops to explore this are taking place in the spring.

Meet our newest member:

<u>Little Gate Supported Employment</u>



At Little Gate Supported Employment we believe that everyone has the right to train for, find and thrive in paid employment. We were born out of a vision to enrich the lives of people with learning disabilities and autism and continue to work tirelessly with families and businesses across East Sussex and Kent to make this vision a reality.

With just 6% of adults with learning disabilities in paid employment, we aim to continue increasing this number until all individuals have the access and opportunities to realise their dreams.

Our service consists of our *Supported Work Training* programme based at Little Gate Farm. Trainees are supported to improve their confidence, independence, and communication, as well as develop specific job skills. Each trainee works with staff to identify and work towards specific, personal goals. Our trainees work in a range of different fields replicating professional industries such as office and administration, hospitality and catering, offsite garden maintenance, horticulture, animal care, and our cut flower and woodland social enterprises. The Supported Work Training program not only benefits trainees' employment opportunities but also enhances their physical and mental wellbeing and can spark life-long friendships.

Little Gate's *Supported Employment* model is all about finding the right employment for the right person; matching our trainees' skills, ambitions, and interests with employers' needs. Our trainees are supported by a Job Coach, prior to and during their employment or work experience and are also offered support in travel training and benefits advice.

Our support does not stop there. We offer *multiple courses* such as LEAPS, The Bridge and Jobs Forum, which are designed to support trainees to deepen their knowledge of employment, further develop their skills to allow trainees to grow within their career, as well as develop independence around relationships, sexual health, time management, self-advocacy and social skills in and out of the workplace.

Little Gate also offers a *Young Ranger* and *Teen Ranger* programme for young people ages eight and up. The programme acts as an activity club and respite for families. With acres of farm and woodland to explore, our Rangers spend their days cooking on campfires, building dens and enjoying the great outdoors.

At Little Gate Supported Employment, we are continuously identifying the gaps and barriers faced by adults with learning disabilities and autism accessing paid work opportunities, to develop and provide the support and services needed to overcome them.
