## Spotlight on an Alliance Member: Welcome to Amaze

Amaze provides information, advice and support to families of children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) and also supports young people with SEND from age 14 to 25.

#### Services across East Sussex include:

- Detailed information, fact sheets, guides and blogs about special educational needs and disability are available <u>here</u>. Contact the free SENDIASS advice line for individual guidance - Email sendiass@amazesussex.org.uk or call 01273 772289.
   For non-English speakers, contact <u>Sussex Interpreting Service</u>
- Regular, free workshops for parent carers on topics such as getting the right SEN support in school, Education, Health and Care (EHC) plans, disability benefits, transition to adulthood, and more. See here. Some workshops are available on YouTube
- Befriending support and regular social groups for parent carers via <a href="Amaze's Face 2 Face Group">Amaze's Face 2 Face Group</a> offering parent carers a way to connect with others, share ideas and mutual support, through themed sessions, speakers or events. Amaze links parents to groups where they can join in as much or as little as they choose. These in-person groups meet at five different locations in East Sussex and online
- Advice and sometimes practical support, for parent carers to make a claim for <u>Disability</u>
   <u>Living Allowance or Personal Independence Payment</u> for a child or young person
- The NDP Family Training and Navigation Service supports families at each stage along the neurodevelopmental pathway from when a condition is first flagged, through referral to assessment, diagnosis and after. Neurodevelopmental conditions include autism, Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder, Foetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorder & tics/Tourette syndrome
- Young people aged 14 to 25 with SEND can join our <u>Amazing Futures</u> project, offering
  peer support and activity groups, one to one careers guidance and workshops about
  employment, education and training and coaching on emotional mental health and
  wellbeing. Amazing Futures young people also run a voice group and work in
  partnership with others to improve local SEND services
- Amaze hosts and supports East Sussex Parent Carer Forum to make sure the voice and views of parent carers are central in planning SEND services

## Alliance activity and latest news

Loneliness & Social Isolation Stewardship Group - establishing a system approach ESCC Adult Social Care and Public Health are funding a stewardship group, looking at how agencies can work together to reduce loneliness and help people be more connected. Alliance members are part of a working group, working alongside statutory partners to understand what success for the people of East Sussex looks like. The group has focused on what systems stewardship is, how partners can contribute individually and collectively through stronger working relationships and agreeing the roles and responsibilities of a host organisation, with the intention the VCSE sector will provide this stewardship role

#### Commissioning Excellence Programme 2023 - 2025

A two-year Commissioning Excellence Programme will run from April 2023, delivered via workshops based on practical, peer-led learning. This multi-partnership programme, hosted by the Alliance and ESCC, aims to develop East Sussex as a centre of excellence for VCSE commissioning; by improving communication, dialogue, trust and understanding between statutory commissioners and VCSE organisations, to enable the culture shift necessary to achieve sustained change

East Sussex VCSE Alliance Position Paper 'VCSE Perspectives on Social Prescribing'

The paper was reviewed by the East Sussex Social Prescribing Information Sharing Group, who supported the Alliance's position and recommended the paper be shared with the pan-Sussex Social Prescribing Strategic Steering Group; the Alliance now has a representative in this group

#### Welfare Benefit & Debt Advice Steering Group

Alliance members have been crucial partners in this multi-agency group, contributing to the independent review of current debt and welfare services, the difficulties faced by the public to navigate the benefit system and recommendations on how to improve services. This information has fed into the multi-agency Financial Inclusion Steering Group action plan, co-chaired by an Alliance member

#### Draft Adult Social Care Strategy for East Sussex

Alliance members have taken part in community engagement, focus groups, workshops and reviews of the draft strategy to support ESCC partners develop their new strategy

## Meet our newest member: Wave Active Ltd

Wave Active is a charity and social enterprise with a Purpose of 'Inspiring Active Lifestyles' and Vision 'To be at the heart of the improvement of health and wellbeing within the Community'.



Formed in 2006, Wave Active is an award-winning Trust, managing 14 leisure facilities and Newhaven Fort, through its contract and agreement with two local district councils.

Wave provide a vast range of membership options for their activities, holiday programmes and outreach initiatives, available at numerous indoor and outdoor facilities; all of which contribute to the health and wellbeing of the local population.

#### Wave Active Health

Wave has developed services which support people to make positive health improvements through physical activity. These fall under the 'Wave Active Health' brand and have been created for those with diagnosed health conditions; physical, mental or emotional, to be more active every day through support - for people to gain, regain or maintain their health and well-being.

Wave has experience of delivering programmes and partnerships linked to falls prevention, musculoskeletal conditions and delivery of cardiac, stroke and pulmonary rehabilitation activities.

Wave has developed 'Make a Move' - a progressive pathway of four group activity sessions to enable participants to move from being less mobile to more mobile, by improving balance, strength and confidence in movement:



- Seated Fitness supporting participants to progress from seated to standing
- Move and Mobilise to reduce falls, aid in the ability to get up independently if fallen, increase confidence and further enhance mobility and strength
- Move More 1 supporting more active participants to work on targeted health outcomes
- 4. Move More 2 progression from Move More 1, to further increase mobility, strength, and conditioning

Sessions are not limited by age - participants are triaged by Health Improvement Practitioners, who ensure participation is appropriate and safe, as well as linked to appropriate goal setting.

People can access sessions through self referral or via referrals from a health professional to a dedicated Health Improvement Practitioner - enabling supportive access in groups or one to one. For more information click <a href="here">here</a>.

#### **Hastings Voluntary Action (HVA)**


Awarded £25,000 to launch new social prescribing project
