East Sussex VCSE Alliance: updates

Sussex VCSE Leaders Alliance: Alliance part of interview process for new Chair

Some of our Alliance members represent East Sussex in the *Sussex VCSE Leaders Alliance*, working at a strategic level, ensuring East Sussex's population and VCSE sector as a 'place' is represented effectively.

Our East Sussex Rep recently participated in a review of the current Sussex Health and Care Assembly membership; proposed changes included the appointment of a new independent Chair of the Sussex VCSE Leaders Alliance.

East Sussex VCSE Alliance members supported the co-design of the process, interviewed and agreed the appointment of the new Chair, Dr Subo Shanmuganathan. We welcome Subo and look forward to working strategically with her and Sussex VCSE Leaders Alliance to improve health & care in East Sussex.

Sussex Health & Care: Alliance supports development of Integrated Community Teams



Sussex Health & Care outlined their ambition to join up health, social care and health-related services across local communities through the development of *Integrated Community Teams* (ICTs). These will work to best meet the needs of the local populations, improve quality and reduce inequalities.

Development has started to bring together key teams and professionals who will work together as a 'team of teams' across primary care, community, mental health, local authorities, VCSE organisations and local partners.

The East Sussex VCSE Alliance is currently working with ESCC officers to co-design VCSE representation and in particular, create a distinct voice for the Alliance, the local Voluntary Actions and other local VCSE networks as appropriate. The Alliance will soon be undertaking a selection process in relation to its nominated VCSE representatives for each of the five ICT footprints working across East Sussex: Lewes, Eastbourne, Wealden, Rother and Hastings, to help design and shape the ICTs.

Hastings Voluntary Action (HVA) represented the Alliance in Hastings, working with County Council and Health colleagues in the development of the frontrunner ICT, that will test the concept.

It aims to engage with local people to build on what works best already and to create a multidisciplinary workforce, tailored to the health and care needs of the community. HVA are also supporting the development of a Community Panel made up of up individuals and community groups who can advise on this process over the next 12 months. Find out more <u>here</u>.
